Failing the nation in science

The Australian Council of Deans of Science wishes to express its deep disappointment at the exclusion of science from the new Federal Government senior Ministry. It is a decision that seriously disadvantages the Australian people, who need a strong sustainable innovations system to power Australia's economic development.

The absence of senior advocacy for science betrays an absence of the kind of long term strategic thinking that other governments apply to their innovations systems. It is doubly sad because the National Innovation and Science Agenda (NISA), announced only two years ago, seemed to promise so much in that more positive direction. It has now been seriously undermined.

We need not rehearse the role of science in innovation, or the need for it to have a place at the table in national policy decisions. The reports of the previous Chief Scientist, and the eloquent advocacy of the current one, have made that case abundantly. We hope that Government might, in the future, recognise once again the importance of an innovation and science agenda, and ensure appropriate senior advocacy for science in its cabinet.
