Some examples of evidence to demonstrate impact of your education leadership

- 1. Student outcomes: improved retention and graduation rates, student satisfaction surveys, graduate employability data, increased participation.
- 2. Academic program development: creation or revitalization of programs, curriculum innovation, accreditation success, positive external reviews.
- 3. Staff development and engagement: mentoring programs, professional development initiatives, staff satisfaction or engagement scores.
- 4. Research leadership: collaborations, publications, HDR completions.
- 5. Strategic and operational impact: strategic plans, effective change, budgetary improvements, improved governance.
- 6. Community and industry engagement: partnerships, outreach programs, knowledge transfer.
- 7. Awards and recognition: awards for leadership or teaching, invitations to speak or advise on educational leadership.
